Dear ACVIM Community,

Earlier this month, the ACVIM Board of Regents held its final meeting of 2022. During this meeting, the Board took the following actions:

- Reviewed preliminary revisions to the following ACVIM strategic objectives:
 - Engagement and Outreach
 - Training and Education
 - Certification
 - Leadership
 - Research and Discovery

The proposed revisions reflect the culmination of a three-phase strategic planning process, which included feedback gathered from ACVIM leaders during a pre-Forum workshop. Once finalized, these objectives will guide our work to serve our community of Diplomates, Members, and Candidates. We expect this work to be complete by the end of the year, and we will share the final language with you in early 2023.

- Approved the 2023 priorities and related budget:
 - Implement improved examination scheduling capability, technology delivery, and quality control of exam content
 - Maestro Launch Phase I of (Maintenance of Credentials) MOC and Board Certification (candidate tracking)
 - o RTP Phase III
 - RTP Oversight Task Force
 - Creation of a relevant, targeted member and candidate communications and support strategy, including waiver of fees for candidates retaking an exam in 2023
 - Development of a Mentoring Program
 - Establish and onboard the Certification Council (If approved by the members as part of the current bylaws revisions)
 - Launch Fellowship Program
 - o Finalize integration of Nutrition membership and certification programs
 - Define a vision and strategy for educational portfolio
 - o Execute findings from marketing and communication consulting engagement
 - Celebrate 40th ACVIM Forum and 50th ACVIM Anniversaries
- Approved a strategic review of the Journal of Veterinary Internal Medicine (JVIM). This work will include engagement
 with authors, readers, members and other stakeholders. Led by Co-Editors-in-Chief Steven DiBartola and Ken
 Hinchcliff, the Steering Committee plans to make recommendations to the Board of Regents by November 2023.
- Reviewed a draft of the AAVMC Recommendations for Veterinary Intern & Resident Wellbeing. This document
 defines recommendations for institutions and their leaders to consider as a means of improving intern and resident
 wellbeing. ACVIM leaders are reaching out to various stakeholder groups to discuss these recommendations and
 will consider whether to sign on as a supporting organization.
