The American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine Announces The Lee & Inge Pyle Service Award, Dr. Rebecca Gompf

Denver, CO (July 10, 2020) – <u>The American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine</u> (ACVIM) announces <u>Dr.</u> <u>Rebecca Gompf</u>, Associate Professor of Small Animal Clinical Sciences, at the University of Tennessee (UT), College of Veterinary Medicine, as the recipient of the 2020 <u>ACVIM Lee & Inge Pyle Service Award</u>. This award is presented annually to an ACVIM Diplomate in recognition of outstanding and dedicated volunteer service to the ACVIM for 10 or more years.

Dr. Rebecca Gompf, DVM, MS, DACVIM (Cardiology) joined the UT College of Veterinary Medicine faculty in 1978 and has taught cardiology to students in every class that has graduated from the college since. She has trained interns and residents in cardiology, medicine, and radiology.

Dr Gompf's dedicated record of service includes assuming the role as the secretary of Cardiology for the ACVIM for 33 consecutive years. In addition, during that time she served on seven ACVIM committees, leading four of those as the Chair. Her volunteer service also spanned numerous college and university committees and as chairperson of the Knox County Board of Health Advisory Committee.
