

LAIM PUBLICATION REQUIREMENT GUIDELINES July 2025 – June 2026

<u>Please note: This document acts as a supplement to Specialty Manual section 3.E.9 and therefore both must be read thoroughly to ensure that all policies and guidelines relevant to the LAIM Publication Requirement are being adhered to.</u>

Publication Criteria

- If a publication is not in English, it is the Candidate's responsibility to provide an independent English translation of the article and other documentation to the LAIM Credentials Committee (LAIM CC).
- The topic of this publication must be relevant to the discipline of large animal internal medicine. Original research, retrospective studies, and review articles are examples of acceptable types of publications. Case reports are not acceptable.
- A manuscript that was submitted to an approved journal but was not accepted by that same journal may be resubmitted to another approved journal and accepted by the LAIM CC.
- A refereed journal is one that is governed by policies and procedures established and
 maintained by a standing editorial board that requires critical review of all papers and
 approval by at least one recognized authority on the subject.
- All publications must be Medline indexed.

If the journal is not one of those listed below: it is the Candidate's responsibility to include a link to a description of the journal's editorial and peer review process or an email/letter from the editor of that journal that outlines the editorial process in detail. If this information does not adequately document to the LAIM CC that the journal is acceptable, the publication will be rejected without further review. This additional step is mandatory whether the Candidate is seeking committee review of a journal prior to or after submitting their manuscript to the journal in question.

^{*}This list is not exhaustive, and many other journals may be acceptable. Candidates are reminded that the topics of these publications must be relevant to the discipline of **internal medicine**.

Instructions for Submitting a Publication When Not Submitting with Credentials Packet and Other Important Notes:

- Publications submitted outside of Credentials Packets (for Specialty Exam Eligibility) must be sent via e-mail to Adam@ACVIM.org.
- All questions or petitions concerning the acceptability of a journal or publication, or the
 acceptance status of a publication must also be sent to Adam@ACVIM.org. Your Staff
 Liaison will send all correspondence and documents to the LAIM CC on your behalf.
- If a Candidate plans to submit their Publication <u>with</u> their Credentials Packet: Any questions concerning the acceptability of a publication should be **sent via email**, **prior** to the submission of the credentials packet. Note that it can take *up to 6 weeks*' time to receive a response.

Acceptance of a publication for credentials may take some time, however, all submissions will be accepted or declined within 60 days of receipt by the ACVIM Certification Specialist.
